Projects Update

Industry feedback on Pharma.Aero's inaugural webinar project "Covid-19 impact on Life Science and Medtech Airfreight Industry"

In the past two months, Pharma.Aero, in collaboration with STAT Trade Times, has run a series of three webinars, where the organization together with world opinion leaders and experts from the industry looked at the current, mid-term and future impact of Covid-19 pandemic on the Life Science and Medtech airfreight industry. It was Pharma.Aero's first webinar project organized for both our members, as well as the pharmaceutical and airfreight industries.

In evaluating the effectiveness of these webinars and identifying improvements for future webinar editions, we have analyzed the feedback collected on each of the webinars.

In total, 580 industry professionals of the Life Science and Medtech airfreight industry followed the webinars. Amongst the three webinars, the first had the highest attendance rate as most parts of the world were still in confinement at that time.

In terms of geographical breakdown of the attendees, 38% of our attendees were in Europe; 37% in Asia; 13% North America and 4% South America. Our members constituted close to 20% of the participants in each of the webinars. With respect to the attendees' industry, 19% were freight forwarders; 15% airlines; 13% airports; 12% pharma shippers; 11% ground handlers; 9% service providers; while the rest comprised of consultants, academics and media companies.

We also assessed the overall content quality, delivery and organisation of the webinars. The scores showed on a Likert-scale 1 to 5 (poor to excellent): 4.23 overall quality; 4.41 opinion leaders; 4.19 industry experts; 4.37 content and 4.40 on the technical elements. This underlines that the webinars were scored "excellent" to "very good" on an overall basis.

When asked about how the participants came to know about our webinars, 40% responded that they received the information through email blasts; 30% on LinkedIn; 20% on our website; while 10% learnt about it from colleagues (especially for the 2nd and 3rd webinar).

Based on the above analysis, we concluded that our series of three webinars has been well-received from the industry. Pharma. Aero would be exploring more opportunities in developing and delivering more webinars for both our members and for the entire industry in the areas of our projects and key activities. In view of the current pandemic when physical distancing is being practiced and country borders



are restricted, webinars are becoming a new way of staying in touch. Looking back at the first experiences of the webinars, Pharma.Aero has realized that there is a need for developing virtual strategies to reach out to our members and the entire industry for the future.
